HURRICANE MELISSA: PIRAC - French Red Cross mobilises to help affected populations

Hurricane Melissa struck south-western Jamaica with great force on 28 October. Described as a 'monster', it is one of the most powerful hurricanes ever recorded in the region.

Faced with the extent of the damage and the gravity of the humanitarian situation, the Jamaican authorities appealed for international assistance. The French Red Cross, through the Americas-Caribbean Regional Intervention Platform (PIRAC) based in Guadeloupe, immediately responded by sending equipment and humanitarian experts to support relief operations.

Hurricane Melissa, whose impact was feared, struck Jamaica with force. Winds reaching nearly 300 km/hour, torrential rains and a storm surge of nearly 4 metres devastated the island. Several towns were flooded, roads were cut off, and essential infrastructure such as hospitals, schools and water networks were severely damaged. Thousands of homes were left without water, electricity and safe shelter. Faced with the extent of the damage, the authorities declared the entire territory a 'disaster area'.

Activation of PIRAC

Responding to this call, PIRAC will deploy human resources and equipment with the support of the Crisis and Support Centre of the French Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs.

This operation aims to support the Jamaican Red Cross in its relief efforts and to strengthen local response capacities.

It is structured around three main components:

- The dispatch, with the support of a vessel of French Armed Forces in the West Indies, of 500 family kits containing essential items (hygiene, shelter, cleaning tools, kitchen utensils, etc.) to meet the immediate needs of affected families;
- The deployment of two water treatment units, in coordination with the Jamaican Ministry of Health and national and regional WASH clusters, to ensure rapid access to safe drinking water;
- The dispatch of specialised human resources, including two PIRAC employees and technical experts in water treatment deployed in partnership with the Veolia Foundation, to support logistics operations, drinking water production and coordination in the field.

Launch of an appeal for donations

Climate change is exacerbating these shocks: while disasters can affect everyone, their consequences are not experienced in the same way. It is the most vulnerable groups – women, children, displaced persons, indigenous communities, families living in poverty or violence – who suffer the most from the effects of hurricanes.
